- 4. Proposals from the Interdisciplinary Program in Linguistics to change the B.A. Degree requirements and the cross-listings of LNG 321 (SPV 322), LNG (SPV) 324 and the cross-listing and prerequisites of LNG (SPV) 323 were approved.
