Master of Science in Nursing

The Department of Nursing offers graduate programs and advanced certificates in Family Nurse Practitioner and Pediatric Nurse Practitioner. Creative and individualized programs of study are used to meet academic requirements and career objectives of graduate nursing students. The programs lead to a Master of Science degree and, with a variety of clients in community and health settings, prepare nurses for advanced practice. The Master of Science degree in nursing program at Lehman College is accredited by the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education (<http://www.ccneaccreditation.org>).

ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS

- Official transcripts from all post-secondary institutions attended
 - Have attained a bachelor's degree with a major in nursing from a CCNE/ACEN/CNEA accredited college or university.
 - Have attained minimum undergraduate grade average of 3.0 (B) in Nursing and the undergraduate record as a whole
- New York State Nursing License (unencumbered)
- New York State Nursing Registration
- Two letters of recommendation
 - One reference must be from a former instructor or academic adviser, and
 - The second from a recent employer or supervisor
- Current professional resume
- A 500-word essay outlining career objectives related to the Master of Science degree in Nursing
- All students must complete a graduate level statistics course and earn a grade of 3.0 (B), or better prior to matriculation
- An interview with a member of the graduate curriculum committee
