A. SENDING AND RECEIVING INSTITUTIONS

B. Admission Requirements for Mercy College Program

(e.g., minimum GPA, audition/portfolio):

Lehman College graduates with the <u>Bachelor of Arts Degree</u> in <u>Interdisciplinary/Women's Studies</u> who meet the following criteria will be guaranteed an interview for admission to the <u>Master of Science Degree</u> in <u>Psychology</u> at Mercy College.

Admissions Criteria:

- Overall GPA > 3.0 (lower GPA may be considered under certain circumstances)
- Major GPA > 3.0
- Minimum 12 credits in major level Psychology courses with a GPA of 3.0 or better
- Grade of B or better in Statistics for Psychology or Behavioral Sciences
- One letter of recommendation written on letterhead from an academic source or professional letter from employer
- A resume
- A personal statement of 3-4 pages stating the student's reasons for pursuing the Master's degree in Psychology.

C. Admissions Process

Students will be required to complete the Application for Graduate Admission, submit Official Transcripts from all undergraduate institutions, the Graduate Application fee and any supporting documents listed above.

Students are required to comply with all posted Mercy College deadlines for graduate admissions.

D. Admission Agreement Follow-Up Procedures

1. Procedures for reviewing, updating, modifying or terminating agreement:

The faculty and administration at Mercy College and Lehman College will review implementation of the agreement once a year to ensure that students are adequately informed of the program and to identify issues requiring attention.

2. Procedures for evaluating agreement, e.g., tracking the number of students who transfer under the articulation agreement and their success:

Applicants and registrants will be tracked by Mercy College. Mercy College will inform Lehman College about the academic progress of students admitted under this agreement.

Mercy College Graduate Admissions and the graduate Psychology program will provide advisement to all students entering this program.

3. Sending and receiving college procedures for publicizing agreement, e.g., college catalogs, transfer advisers, websites, etc.:

Information regarding this articulation will be shared with Career Services and Student Services Counselors at Mercy College so that interested students may be advised of the opportunity. Written documentation regarding the articulation will be provided by Lehman College and distributed to these students.

Program faculty at both institutions will coordinate program information sessions as welcomed by the sending institution. At Mercy College the School of Liberal Arts, School of Health and Natural Sciences and the Office of Career Services will coordinate any potential onsite sessions.

Mercy College (at Mercy's expense) may promote this agreement during the academic year via mail and/or email to potential students.
