29 President Ricardo Fernández called the meeting to order at 2:10 p.m.

30 **Minutes Adopted**

31 A motion was made and seconded to adopt the minutes of the Senate  
32 meeting of May 2, 2007 with the correction that Associate Dean Susan  
33 Polirstok was present. The minutes were unanimously approved.

35 ***Announcements and Communication-***

36  
37 **a. President Ricardo R. Fernández-**

38 President Fernández extended greetings to the Senate, wishing all the students success in  
39 their finals and the faculty a restful and productive summer, recharging our batteries so  
40 we can come back renewed in the fall.

41 **b. Student Conference-**

42 Their was no formal report, but student Conference Chair Mr. Avraham Abelda invited  
 43 everyone to a student-sponsored luncheon which will be held in B-16 immediately  
 44 following the Senate meeting.

45 **REPORTS OF THE STANDING COMMITTEES-**

46

47 **a. Committee on Governance-**

- 48 1. Prof. Vincent Prohaska reported that those elected to serve as at-large Senators 2007-  
 49 2009 are being notified.
- 50 2. The Committee on Academic Freedom has been asked to monitor proposals for  
 51 changes in the Institutional Review Board that might impact on Academic Freedom.
- 52 3. A meeting has not yet been set for the fall term.

53

54 **b. Committee on Admissions, Evaluations and Academic Standards-**

55 There was no report.

56

57 **c. Undergraduate Curriculum –**

- 58 1. Prof. Barbara Jacobson reported changes in the Department of Journalism,  
 59 Communication and Theatre, the Department of Health Sciences, and the Women's  
 60 Studies Program. The report was approved.
- 61 2. The Committee will be meeting in the fall on Wednesdays at noon.

62

63 **d. Committee on Graduate Studies-**

64 Prof. Robin Kunstler presented two proposals from Graduate Studies: one from the  
 65 Department of Health Sciences; changes in the Master's degree in Recreation Education,  
 66 and some minor changes from the Department of Speech-Language-Hearing Sciences.  
 67 The report was approved.

68 **e. Committee on Academic Freedom-**

69 There was no report.

70 **f. Committee on the Library, Technology and Telecommunications-**

71 1. Prof. Esther Wilder wished to make an amendment to the first “whereas” clause of the  
72 resolution concerning a user’s guide. The clause with the suggested change, reads as  
73 follows: “Whereas, A written user’s guide is not routinely made available to incoming  
74 members of the Lehman community concerning the use of the Leonard Lief Library and  
75 Information Technology (IT) resources.” The amendment was approved. (A minor  
76 change was approved in the fourth “whereas” clause to correct a typo as follows:  
77 “Reference faculty in the library are currently spending large portions of their time  
78 explaining the new print/copy management system to students as opposed to performing  
79 their job as [‘as’ substituted for ‘are’] reference faculty”). The resolution was approved,  
80 as amended.

81 2. President Fernández commented on student use of e-mail. He said that the college has  
82 encouraged the use of e-mail. Ideally, all our students should be using their Lehman e-  
83 mail accounts, because that’s the way the College sends out information. “We are in  
84 2007; we’re not in 1977, so we are going electronic, and we are cutting down on the use  
85 of paper absolutely across the board, and people have to get used to that.”

86 3. The second resolution concerns undertaking Student and Faculty Technology Surveys  
87 at Lehman College, and states as follows: “Whereas, Information regarding the  
88 technology needs of students and faculty is vital to the planning and development of an  
89 efficient IT infrastructure on campus, Therefore, be it resolved, that Lehman undertake  
90 separate faculty and student surveys on a regular basis. The faculty and student surveys  
91 should be undertaken separately since the concerns and needs of both groups are not  
92 identical and separate surveys will need to be developed. The student and faculty surveys  
93 should be staggered so that a technology survey is undertaken at Lehman every two  
94 years.” The resolution was approved as presented.

95 4. The next committee meeting will be from 11 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. on May 22 in the  
96 library conference room.

98 **g. Committee on Campus Life and Facilities-**

99 There was no report.

100 **h. Committee on Budget and Long-Range Planning-**

101 There was no report.

102 **i. University Faculty Senate-**

103 1. Prof. Patricia Kolb presented the report for Professor Manfred Phillip. She said the  
104 most recent University Faculty Senate Plenary was held on Tuesday, May 16. A  
105 presentation was made by Vice Chancellor Jay Hershenson in which he reported CUNY  
106 initiatives in the University's Identity Campaign in which students and faculty are  
107 showcased. The result is seen on bus advertising showing professors from various CUNY  
108 colleges, including Lehman. He highlighted the achievements of the City University of  
109 New York's Citizenship and Immigrant Project. During the "Citizenship Now!" public  
110 service project that took place for one week at the beginning of May, volunteers took  
111 calls from 12,895 people who called the CUNY/Daily News phone anonymously to ask  
112 questions that were primarily about citizenship and permanent residency. This is the fifth  
113 year for the one week phone-in; last year there were calls from 7,362 people. CUNY also  
114 has seven immigration centers throughout the five boroughs, an initiative begun ten years  
115 ago, and will be opening a new center in Washington Heights next month.

116 2. Vice Chancellor Hershenson also said that the Chancellor's office is continuing work  
117 with the City and State regarding the budget; there may be a State supplemental budget in  
118 June, and so the Chancellor's Office is working closely with people on all sides of these  
119 negotiations.

120 3. Last night the CUNY Faculty Senate approved a resolution concerning the PSC/CUNY  
121 Research Award Program that will be forwarded to the appropriate parties for approval.  
122 The resolution includes a proposal that CUNY double the funding for the award program  
123 from \$6 million to \$12 million and that the increase be made out of existing university  
124 funds. It is also proposed that the award program be "extended to all faculty, including  
125 adjuncts with at least three years of CUNY service and/or who teach at least two CUNY  
126 courses."

127 4. Another subject of importance is that CUNY has invoked eminent domain over the  
128 Structural Biology Center at City College in response to protests at the Center regarding  
129 construction of three buildings next to it and the vibrations caused by the construction.  
130 The Center is a consortium of several public and private universities.

131 5. A presentation about the research findings and the report of the Modern Language  
132 Association Task Force on Evaluating Scholarship for Tenure and Promotion was made  
133 by Modern Language Association Executive Director Rosemary Feals. Copies of the

136 **OLD BUSINESS**

137 1. At the last meeting, President Fernández was asked if he would report on what Lehman  
138 College is doing vis-à-vis the tragedy at Virginia Tech. He noted that there was an  
139 extensive report and discussion at the last faculty meeting. Vice President Derek Wheeler  
140 indicated that we have a communications system at this institution which enables Public  
141 Safety to receive notification when a problem erupts. These stations can be seen around  
142 the campus. They have buttons that, when pressed, immediately connect with the Public  
143 Safety office. Also the entire campus is covered by cameras so the response is going to be  
144 quick. The problem at Virginia Tech was for security to get information back to the  
145 students in the classrooms in buildings across the campus. In examining our current  
146 security capabilities we have learned that with some additional programming, our  
147 security will be able to send messages to everybody through these communication  
148 stations. The University is also looking into the possibility of text messaging. Dr.  
149 Annecy Báez, the director of the Counseling Center, also gave a comprehensive  
150 presentation on working with students who experience anxieties and concerns from such  
151 circumstances.

152 Vice President José Magdaleno was called to the podium to share his thoughts. Prior to  
153 the Virginia Tech tragedy, he said the college recognized the importance of bringing  
154 additional staff resources to the campus. Fortunately, we are able to do that. He added  
155 that he would like to bring three items to the Senate's attention: Dr. Annecy Báez,  
156 submitted a grant that has been funded and allows us to hire a full-time clinician who will  
157 focus on issues of depression and anxiety which are the type of acting out behavior that  
158 concern us. Secondly, working with the Graduate Center and with the Vice Chancellor  
159 for Student Development in the Central Office, we will have a part-time clinical  
160 psychology doctoral fellow placed in the Counseling Center. And lastly, with the  
161 assistance of CUNY Compact II funds, we expect to begin a search for a full-time  
162 clinician. So these are concrete steps that are being taken to increase the availability of  
163 counseling services for students. We would expect to continue and accelerate this  
164 program in the semesters ahead.

165 2. President Fernández then opened the discussion on the proposed Mission, Vision and  
 166 Values Statements, which were projected on a large screen, so that changes could be  
 167 made as the discussion proceeded. Additions and modifications were introduced from the  
 168 Senate floor and suggested changes were put in the form of resolutions. President  
 169 Fernández led the Senators through the Statements, paragraph by paragraph, putting  
 170 specific suggestions from the floor to a vote and then incorporating and displaying the  
 171 changes that were approved. **The Lehman College Mission, Vision, Values Statements**  
 172 were approved as follows:

173 **Mission Statement**

174 Lehman College serves the Bronx and surrounding region as an intellectual, economic, and cultural  
 175 center. Lehman College provides undergraduate and graduate studies in the liberal arts and sciences  
 176 and professional education within a dynamic research environment, while embracing diversity and  
 177 actively engaging students in their academic, personal, and professional development.  
 178  
 179

180 **Vision Statement**

181 Lehman College has entered a new era in its history as an institution of higher education. Already  
 182 known for its outstanding faculty, dedicated staff, superb library, art gallery, theaters, speech and  
 183 hearing clinic, and athletic facilities, the College will now build a new state of the art,  
 184 environmentally “green” science facility that will invigorate faculty and student research as well as  
 185 prepare Lehman students for science-based careers.  
 186

187 Supported by the University’s expanding technological resources, the College will promote creative  
 188 teaching strategies, greater access to courses through online learning, off campus access to library  
 189 resources and enhanced student services. The new Multi-Media Center will stimulate technological  
 190 innovation in all areas of communications and the arts for both the College and the region.  
 191

192 Lehman has always been a commuter campus that prides itself on its diversity and commitment to  
 193 multicultural understanding. Now, the College looks forward to providing a residential experience to  
 194 attract a wider range of students and lead to the development of new learning communities to enhance  
 195 student success.  
 196

197 Lehman College will prepare students to live and work in the global community through new  
 198 interdisciplinary programs, such as environmental studies and international business, along with study  
 199 abroad and experiential learning opportunities. The College’s geographic information systems and  
 200 numerous partnerships with schools, hospitals, social service and governmental agencies, small  
 201 businesses, major corporations, and cultural and scientific institutions will contribute to the economic  
 202 development of the region. Service learning and internship opportunities will be further developed to  
 203 foster the engaged citizenship and commitment to public service embodied in its namesake, Herbert  
 204 H. Lehman.  
 205

206 Recognized for small classes, close interaction between students and faculty, a successful Teacher  
 207 Academy and Honors College, and a caring and supportive environment, Lehman College will  
 208 celebrate its fiftieth anniversary in 2018 as the college of choice in the region, committed to preparing  
 209 students for graduate studies, professional careers, and lifelong learning.  
 210

212 **Values Statement**

213 Lehman College is committed to providing the highest quality education in a caring and supportive  
214 environment where respect, integrity, inquiry, creativity, and diversity contribute to individual  
215 achievement and the transformation of lives and communities.  
216

217 **NEW BUSINESS**

218 Student Conference Chair Mr. Avraham Albelda submitted a resolution as follows: "Resolved, that  
219 all instructors be urged to make known to their students the hours and contact information for  
220 tutoring services available in their subject areas." The resolution was approved.



MOTIONS FOR THE SENATE MEETING OF SEPTEMBER 23, 2009

- A. Whereas as a consequence of the policy of "saving paper" on the publication of Senate agendas, when a motion is presented, many Senate members find themselves voting without having a secure idea of the content and phraseology of the motion under discussion,  
Resolved, that the Senate asks that at the beginning of each Senate meeting the Governance Committee shall circulate printed copies of all motions submitted for discussion, with the exception of curriculum proposals which run to more than one page.
- B. Whereas the requirement that for votes on policy issues, the name together with vote (his or her personal vote of yes, no or abstention) of each Senate member be recorded may tend to intimidate some members of the Senate by opening their personal choices to potential scrutiny,  
Resolved that in the case of a vote on a policy issue, the actual vote shall be preceded by a straw vote which shall consist of a non-binding paper ballot, with no recording of names of those voting, the result of which paper ballot to be announced to the Senate together with the result of the actual vote.
- C. Whereas, based on evidence from a number of campuses, CUNY's administration appears to be embarked this year on a new hiring policy emphasizing so-called "substitute" positions and the non tenure-bearing ranks of lecturer and instructor, and sharply reducing the proportion of faculty hires in tenure-bearing ranks, [at Lehman, the statistics being that of 36 hires, 27 were substitutes (6 substitute lecturers, 7 substitute instructors and 8 substitute assistant professors), or lecturers or instructors (4 lecturers and 2 instructors), while 9 were regular tenure-bearing ranks (8 assistant professors, 1 a full professor)], and  
  
Whereas continuing such a policy will have negative effects on the educational quality of CUNY,  
  
Resolved that the Lehman College Senate recommends to the Chancellor and the central administration of CUNY, that this year and in subsequent years a balanced pattern of hiring of tenure-track and non-tenure-track faculty be restored.
