The reverse (tails) features a dynamic depiction of Celia Cruz flashing her dazzling smile while performing in a rumba-style dress. Her signature catchphrase "¡AZÚCAR!" is inscribed on the right. Everyone who attends will get an up-close look at the coin when they receive one of these special quarters as a keepsake.
