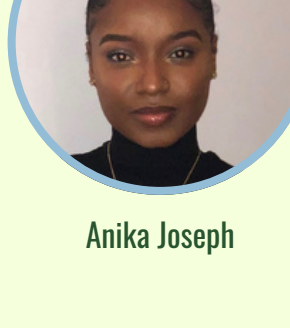

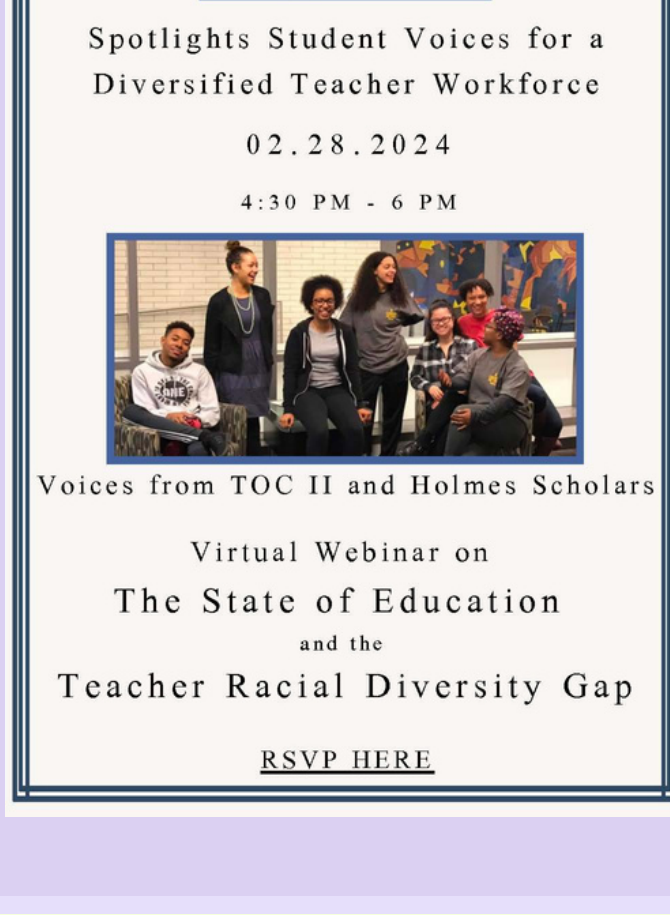

Design Thinking Workshop

This summer, join Mouse, a NYC-based non-profit education organization that prepares students and educators with the skills to access careers in tech. In this unique professional learning experience, you will utilize STEM and User Experience/User Interface (UX/UI) skills to design a digital solution for a real-world problem. An engaging, project-based approach applies human-centered design to a challenge facing your community. Additionally, you will identify and explore the fundamentals of artificial intelligence and how AI transforms digital problem-solving.

Topics covered in the workshops will include:

- Identifying real-world problems and user needs
- Learning professional approaches to UX/UI design and style
- Prototyping and pitching solutions that you design
- Using artificial intelligence for generating text, images, and more

This program will consist of 20 hours of combined synchronous and asynchronous work. Sessions are expected to take place on Saturdays in June 2024. More details about registration, dates and venues will be provided at a later time.
